FREDERICTON, THURSDAY, MARCH 10, 1927.

This being the day appointed by proclamation for the meeting of the Legislature, at three o'clock His Honour, William Frederic Todd, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Assembly Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, was pleased to open the Session with the following:

SPEECH

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly:—

In again welcoming you to the discharge of your duties I note with regret that death has removed from your numbers Mr. John L. Peck one of the members for Albert County whose services in this House will long be remembered.

The office of Governor General has been relinquished by Lord Byng of Vimy, who, during his term became our greatest Canadian. He has been succeeded by Lord Willingdon whom we welcome as the representative of His Majesty.
