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TIMBER REGULATIONS

In Effect 1st August, 1927.

1. The Provisions of Chapter 11, 3 Geo.
V., 1912, are now applicable to all Saw
Mill and Puip and Paper Licenses.
2. Saw Mill Licenses extend for a period of twenty years from 1st August, 1913
with a renewal of ten years, as specified
in above Act, upon continued compliance
with the said Act, with the Order-inCouncil dated 19th July, 1913, providing
for the payment of the bonus as set forth
in said Act and these Regulations.
