"GLOUCESTER ESTATES, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Twenty-eighth day of September, A. D. 1927, incorporating Sir James Hamet Dunn, Bart., Banker; Lady Irene Dunn, Married Woman; and Marie E. Rawson, Stevedore; all of the City of London, England; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire the following real estate: Somerset Vale Farm, approximately 1,100 acres, situate in the Parish of Bathurst, New Brunswick, and the Swinny Grant so called, approximately 1,750 acres, and other lands adjacent thereto, situate on the

To make such agreements and arrangements as may be desired for permitting members or shareholders of the Company and other persons to enjoy and use all fishing privileges owned by the Company, and also hunting privileges upon the lands of the Company or elsewhere in every lawful manner.

To engage such and so many game, fishery and fire wardens as may be deemed necessary for the care and preservation of the hunting and fishing privileges and properties of the Company, and or to agree with the Government of New Brunswick for the employment of any and such guardians or wardens, in every lawful manner.
