

## Letters Patent Granted

### "THE VOGUE, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Fifth day of February, A. D. 1927, incorporating Jennie M. Harris, wife of Louis N. Harris, Merchant; Michael Baig, Commercial Traveller; and Maurice I. Cummings, Doctor of Chiropractic; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To buy, sell, import, export and deal in cloaks, kimonoes, dressing sacques, negligees, gowns, robes, waists, skirts and all kinds of garments and wearing apparel especially for women.

To conduct and carry on the business of cutting out, making, preparing, altering and manufacturing clothing and wearing apparel of all kinds.

To carry on the business of costumers, robe, dress and mantle merchants, tailors, silk mercers and suppliers of clothing, lingerie and trimmings of every kind, corset makers, furriers, general drapers, haberdashers, milliners, hatters, gloves, lace makers and dealers, feather dressers and merchants, batters, boot and shoe makers, dealers in fabrics and materials of all kinds, ribbon, fans, perfumes and flowers (artificial and natural).

To buy, sell, import, export and deal generally in and with all kinds of textile goods, wares and merchandise and to prepare, manufacture and deal in all kinds of dry-goods, cloths and textile fabrics and garments and other manufactures of the same.

To conduct and carry on a general wholesale and retail dry and white goods business in all its branches.

Generally to buy, sell, import, export and manufacture and deal in and with textile fabrics, leather goods, household and office furniture, china, glassware, crockery, pottery, utensils, notions, fancy goods, soaps, perfumery and drugs, medicines, toilet articles and all kinds and descriptions of goods, wares and commodities.

To carry on a general mercantile business and buy, sell, manufacture and deal in goods, merchandise, consumable articles and general property of all kinds both wholesale and retail.

To transact every kind of agency business.

Generally to engage in any business or transaction which may seem to the Company directly or indirectly conducive to its interests.

To carry on business and to act as merchants, brokers, traders, commission merchants, general agents, ship owners or in any other capacity.

To import, export, buy, sell, barter, exchange, pledge, make advances upon or otherwise deal in goods, produce articles and merchandise.

To sell or dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.

To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

To buy, sell, lease or otherwise acquire and hold, sell or otherwise dispose of real estate.

To act as real estate brokers and agents.

To carry on any business of a similar nature or any business which may in the opinion of the Directors be conveniently carried on by the Company.

No object, purpose or power or any statement contained in any of the above clauses shall be in any way limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other clauses but shall be construed as independent purposes and powers, by the name of "The Vogue, Limited", with a capital stock of Nine Thousand and Nine Hundred Dollars divided into Ninety-nine shares of One Hundred Dollars each, with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
