B., marked "Tender for Contract No. 83" Graveling highway from Campbellton West Limit to about ¼ mile west of Miller Road, on the

Campbellton-Matapedia Highway, a distance of approximately 1.0 mile.

Grave to be obtained from pit along the old I. N. R. line, and shall conform to the specifications of the Department.

Approximate quantity of gravel 1500 cubic yards, to be measured according to the cubic contents of the loads as delivered.

Gravel to be distributed along the road inside the shoulder as directed, and spread and dragged by the Contractor early in the Spring, or at such a time as may be directed by the Chief Highway Engineer. Work to be completed not later than June 15, 1927.

The price bid shall be a unit price per cubic yard for the gravel in place on the road, no overhaul allowed.
