"RED BANK FISHING CLUB LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Twenty-seventh day of April A. D. 1927, incorporating Richard B. Hanson, King's Counsel; Charles L. Dougherty, Barrister; and Evelyn Whyte, Secretary; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To promote, organize, conduct and manage a fishing and social club, and to promote the welfare of the members thereof, with power to make and adopt a constitution and by-laws, rules and regulations for the admission, suspension and expulsion of its members and for their government and with full power and authority to make by-laws, rules and regulations, providing that the shares of the capital stock of the Company shall not be transferable to any person not being a member of, and shareholder in the Company, until the name of the proposed transferee or shareholder has been first submitted for the approval of the existing shareholders or members and approved in such manner as may be prescribed by the by-laws, rules and regulations of the Company, when incorporated.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, fishing and other rights, including riparian rights and any interest in real property with power and authority to pay for any such property and rights by the allotment and issue of shares of the capital stock of the Company, fully paid-up and non-assessable.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any personal property and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of a fishing or other club.

To sell or dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures, or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

To have all the powers vested in the Company as are mentioned and enumerated in Section 14, of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", as amended by the provisions of the Act of Assembly, Chapter 35, 8 George V., 1918, by the name of "Red Bank Fishing Club Limited", with a capital stock of Twenty-four Thousand dollars divided into two hundred and forty shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office at Kedgewick, in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick, with permission to hold the annual meetings of the Company, and special meetings of the shareholders and meetings of the Directors of the Company, as well without as within the Province of New Brunswick.

NEW MINING ACT

The public is hereby informed of the passage on April 21st, 1927 of a Mining Act to take the place of the one up to that time in force. Under the provisions of the new Act no prospecting or searching for minerals may be made without first obtaining a prospecting license but upon obtaining this license, the fee for which is ten dollars, the holder thereof may stake out one or more but not exceeding ten claims of 40 acres each. These claims must be recorded at the Department of Lands and Mines, Fredericton within thirty days. If certain required work is performed on the claims the holder thereof may obtain a yearly mining license at a cost of \$10 per claim. The opening up and working of a mine on a claim entitles the holder to the privilege of a twenty years' lease at the rate of \$10 per year per claim with extensions up to eighty years.
