Letters Patent Granted

"MARITIME GRAVEL COMPANY LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the ninth day of August, A. D. 1927, incorporating Emery LeBanc, Merchant; Owen LeBlanc, Merchant; and Simeon Melanson, Trader; all of the Parish of Dorchester in the County of Westmorland, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To buy, lease, sell, rent, develop and deal in real estate, timber limits and other interest in lands and generally to carry on the business of a real estate company, and for such purposes to buy, lease, sell, rent and generally to deal in lands, houses

cottages, shops, offices, hotels and other buildings and real estate of all kinds.

To carry on the business of dealers and workers in gravel, gravel miners and quarrymen.

To search for, quarry, mine and make merchantable, manufacture, use, buy, sell and deal in stone, artificial stone, marl, shale, slate, clay, gravel, sand and earths, and all articles composed of all or any of the same.

To carry on the business as timber merchants, saw-mill proprietors and timber growers, and to buy, sell, prepare for market, manipulate, import and export deal in timber and wood of all kinds.

To own and operate tools and appliances of all kinds capable of being used in connection with the objects and operations of the Company.

To construct, buy, lease and otherwise acquire railways and other means of transportation to and from any place where any of the Company's operations are carried on, and operate the same in connection with its own business upon lands owned or controlled by the Company.

To acquire or undertake the whole, or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or corporation carrying on any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the Company.

To promote, carry on, engage in and prosecute any and all the aforementioned objects as principals, agents, contractors, and supervisors and to let and sublet contracts for any and all of the aforementioned objects.

To conduct and carry on a general wholesale and retail mercantile business in goods, wares and merchandise of every nature, kind and description.

To establish agencies or branches in any and all places it may see fit and to do any and all lawful business incidental or in any way connected with the purposes or any of them, by the name of "Maritime Gravel Company Limited", with a Capital Stock of Ten Thousand Dollars, divided into shares of Twenty-five Dollars each, with the Head Office at College Bridge, in the County of Westmorland, Province of New Brunswick.
