A PROCLAMATION

George R.I.

Whereas by the Royal and Parliamentary Titles Act, 1927, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for us by our Royal Proclamation under the Great Seal of the Realm issued within six months after the passing of the said Act to make such alteration in the style and titles at present appertaining to the Crown as to us may seem fit:

And whereas our present style and titles are, in the Latin tongue, "Georgius V. Dei Gratia Britanniarum et terrarum transmarinarum quae in ditone sunt Britannica Rex, Fidel Defensor, Indiae Imperator," and in the English tongue, "George V. by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India:"

And whereas We have received a recommendation from the representatives of Our Governments in Conference assembled that Our style and titles should be altered as in manner hereinafter appearing:

We have thought fit, and We do hereby appoint and declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that hence-

forth so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein Our style and titles are used, the following alteration shall be made in the style and titles at present appertaining to the Crown, that is to say, in the Latin tongue, for the word "Britanniarum" there shall be substituted the words "Magna Britanniae, Hiberniae," and in the English tongue, for the words "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of" the words "Great Britain, Ireland and of."

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-seven, and in the Eighteenth year of Our Reign.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that George L. Miller, Chief Forester, and Harold H. Ritchie, Chief Game Warden, be appointed Commissioners for taking affidavits to be read in the Supreme Court and that the Commissions be issued to them without payment of fee.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that the appointment of George Hughes of Oromocto as Labor Act Commissioner for the Parish of Burton, Sunbury County, be discontinued.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that Stanley Howe of Geary be appointed Labor Act Commissioner for the Parish of Burton, Sunbury County, in place of George Hughes of Oromocto.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Health that the following additional regulation be adopted:

27A. Rabies or hydrophobia is hereby declared a notifiable disease, whether in man or a lower animal.

When such disease occurs or is suspected, if in man, it shall be at once notified to the health authority as is laid down in these Regulations relating to Notifiable Disease, and all provisions contained in such Regulations having regard to the care of the person so affected or suspected to be affected shall obtain with respect to this disease when such provisions are applicable or appropriate. In addition, every practicable effort shall be made to have the person so affected or suspected to be affected, receive preventive inoculation against rabies as soon as possible. For such purpose it is most desirable that such preventive treatment be given in a hospital.

In the matter of rabies in the lower animals, such instances shall be at once reported to the Sanitary Inspector, the Secretary of the Board of Health, or the District Medical Health Officer concerned, and either or both of the latter shall at once apprise the Chief Medical Officer. The latter shall in his discretion advise the Minister to make an order that all dogs be securely muzzled and that no dog shall appear upon any street or highway or other open space except under leash and that all dogs not so secured may be at once destroyed. This order shall apply to the community affected or supposedly
