

affected and shall obtain so long as there remains any suspicion of rabies in the said community, and such interval shall be determined by the Minister.

Any animal suspected of rabies shall be at once securely confined by the sanitary inspector, who may call any competent person or persons to aid him in such action, and such officer under the direction and superintendence of the District Medical Health Officer concerned or, if necessary, any such officer, shall sever the head and some inches of the neck of the animal from the body, pack it in ice and at once ship it by express to the Provincial Pathologist for examination, who shall report the findings to the Chief Medical Officer as soon as possible. If such findings be positive, all other animals similarly suspected may at the instance of the sanitary inspector be at once destroyed or securely confined as above, for twelve days, at the expiration of which time, if the animal during the interval has remained clinically well, it may be released under the precautions prescribed by this regulation.

"GYRO CLUB OF MONCTON, N. B., LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Tenth day of June, A. D. 1927, incorporating Philip W. Allen, Manager; Frederick C. Macdonald, Insurance Superintendent; Charles R. Baxter, Physician and Surgeon; G. Reginald Spencer, Druggist; John W. Humphrey, Automobile Dealer; George F. MacNeill, Banker; and Jerome A. Morris, Merchant; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes namely:
