### LEPREAU RIVER GAME REFUGE

Public Notice is hereby given that the following described area is set apart as a Game Refuge, to take effect on and after January first, 1928. This area is situated in the Parish of:

Clarendon, Pennfield and Lepreau in the County of Charlotte.  
Petersville in the County of Queens, and Westfield in the County of Kings, and more particularly described as follows:

Timber Blocks numbers 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, Ranges 3 and 4, and numbers 4, 5, 6 and 7, Range 5 and the portions of Block number 2, Ranges 3 and 4, and Blocks numbers 8 and 9, Range 5, West of the West Branch of the Musquash River, containing ninety-four (94) square miles, more or less.

No person has the right to hunt or trap for or disturb game, fur-bearing animals or birds found within the limits of this game refuge, or travel upon it with either a gun or dog at any time.

The Penalty provided for hunting or trapping within a game refuge is \$300 or six months imprisonment.
