Letters Patent Granted

"AROOSTOOK VALLEY COUNTRY CLUB, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Fourth day of October, A. D. 1927, incorporating Daniel W. Haines, Farmer; George W. Reed, Farmer, both of Port Fairfield, in the State of Maine, one of the United States of America; Guy G. Porter, Merchant; of Andover, in the County of Victoria, in the Province of New Brunswick; Frank B. Thompson, Merchant; of Presque Isle, in the State of Maine, one of the United States of America; and John B. Roberts, Attorney; of Carleton Place, in the State of Maine, one of the United States of America; for the following purposes, namely:

To promote, organize, conduct and manage a golf, tennis, country and social club, and to promote the welfare of the members thereof, with power to make and adopt a constitution and by-laws, rules and regulations for the admission, suspension and expulsion of its members, and for their government, and for the establishment of different classes of membership and for the collection of fees and dues, for the election and appointment of its Directors and other Officers, and to define their duties, and for the safekeeping and protection of its property and funds, and in general to regulate, manage and preserve its property and interests and from time to time to alter, repeal, rescind or vary such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations or any of them.

With power for the Directors from time to time in addition to the powers given them under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Act, to make by-laws, not contrary to law, as follows:

To establish different classes of membership and to regulate the admission of members and requirements of membership, the cessation thereof and the expulsion and suspension therefrom or forfeiture thereof.

To appoint committees to manage the affairs of the corporation and to pass, adopt and enforce rules and regulations therefor, by the name of "Aroostook Valley Country Club, Limited" with a capital stock of Twenty-four thousand nine hundred Dollars divided into Nine hundred and Ninety six shares of Twenty-five dollars each, and the shares of the capital stock of the Company shall not be transferable to any person not then being a member of and Shareholder in the Company until the name of the proposed transferee has been first submitted for the

approval of the existing Shareholders or Members and approved by the by-laws of the Company when incorporated, with the head office in the Parish of Grand Falls, in the County of Victoria and Province of New Brunswick.

Public Notice is hereby given that under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Eighth day of October, A. D. 1927, incorporating Hugh H. McLean, Junior, Barrister-at-Law; T. Louis McGloan, Barrister-at-Law; and Oscar Ring, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of hotel, restaurant, cafe, tavern, refreshment booth and lodging house keepers, licensed victuallers, tobacco merchants, importers and manufacturers of aerated, mineral and artificial waters and other drinks, purveyors, caterers for public amusements and functions generally, automobile, coach, cab, and carriage proprietors, livery stable keepers, garage, bowling alley and billiard parlor proprietors, real estate agents, brokers, carriers, warehousemen, agents for railway and shipping companies and carriers, theatrical and opera box office proprietors, general agents and any other business which can be conveniently carried on in connection therewith.

To construct, acquire, own, operate, manage, deal in and otherwise dispose of buildings, works and real estate, in such manner and upon such terms as the Company may deem fit.

To draw, take, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, debentures, warehouse receipts, or other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To raise money for the purposes of the Company on such terms, in such manner and in such amounts as the Company shall think fit.

And it is hereby declared that the intention is that the objects set forth in any sub-clause foregoing shall not, except where the context expressly so requires, be in anywise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the term of any other sub-clause, or by the name of the Company. None of such sub-clauses or the objects therein specified or the powers thereby conferred shall be deemed subsidiary or auxiliary merely to the
