the Lumber Industry, the rate of stumpage on certain kinds of lumber as herein-after stated be as follows:

For spruce, fir, pine and hemlock when used for saw logs per M. feet	\$3.00
For spruce, fir, pine or other soft woods when used for pulpwood per M. feet	\$3.50
For Hemlock per M. feet	\$2.50
For Poplar per M. feet	\$1.75
For Cedar per M. feet	\$2.50

The above rates to be substituted for the rates previously fixed.

Letters Patent Granted

"FARMERS MERCANTILE, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Thirteenth day of July, A. D. 1927, incorporating Henry Lehr, Farmer, of Hanwell, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; Franklin C. Armstrong, Farmer, of the Parish of St. Marys, in the County of York and Province aforesaid; and James P. Harding, Farmer, of the Parish of Maudslayi, in the County of York and

Province aforesaid; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire, own and operate a store or stores dealing in all lines of mercantile business.

To acquire, own and carry on the business of wholesale and retail dealing in and purchasing of all kinds and classes of goods, wares and merchandise incidental thereto, and to act as agents for dealers or manufacturers of any such goods, wares and merchandise.

To establish agencies and branch stores.

To carry on all or any businesses, both wholesale and retail, as general merchants, shippers, general agents and warehousemen.

To buy, sell, import, export, warehouse, store and deal in products of every description, goods, wares, merchandise, and manufactured articles.

To buy and sell and deal in and deal with all classes of grain and other cereals and agricultural products and all kinds of seed and to receive the same on consignment or otherwise, and to sell the same on commission or otherwise and generally conduct the business and deal in grain and seed and all produce or merchandise, and to buy and sell flour and other food articles manufactured from grain and cereals.

To acquire by purchase, all implements, buildings and property necessary or incidental to the carrying on of such business or businesses, by the name of "Farmers Mercantile, Limited", with a capital stock of Nineteen Thousand Dollars divided into One Hundred and Sixty Shares of Seven Per Cent Preferred Stock of the par value of Twenty five Dollars Each, and Six Hundred Shares of Common Stock, of the par value of Twenty five Dollars each. The holders of Preferred Stock only are to have voting power in the said proposed Company and holders of Preferred Stock only shall be entitled to participate in the distribution of assets of the proposed Company in the event of the said proposed Company being wound up. The holders of Common Stock shall have no voting power and no right to participation in the assets of the Company as such, with the head office at the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick.
