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NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

NOTICE is hereby given that an application will be made at the next session of the Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick for the passing of an Act:

(a). Authorizing the Town of Campbellton to borrow from time to time, from a chartered bank, such sum or sums of money as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying on the ordinary services of the Town, such amount to be borrowed outstanding at any time not to exceed two-thirds of the amount of the previous year's assessment.

(b). To exempt from taxation certain property of the Town of Campbellton lying outside the Town of Campbellton and within the County of Restigouche.

(c). To acquire by purchase, lease, or otherwise, or without the consent of the owner thereof enter upon, take possession of, expropriate and use lands within the County of Restigouche over which the transmission line, as now located and used for the transmission of electric power and energy between Matapedia and Campbellton, extends.

(d). To amend the Town of Campbellton Incorporation Act, and amendments thereto, providing for the extension of the term of office of the Mayor and Councillors from one to two years, and regulate such term of office of Councillors so that four of such Councillors will be elected yearly.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at the next

session thereof, by the Town of Bathurst, for the passing of an act,

1. To authorize the Town to issue debentures in an amount or amounts not exceeding in the whole one hundred thousand dollars, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable forty years after date of issue, for the purpose of building streets of a permanent nature in the Town, and with power to expend portions of the money realized from the sale of such bonds, from time to time, in part payment of any street or Highway work which may be undertaken by the Government of New Brunswick, within the limits of the Town, under any agreement or agreements the Town Council may make with the Government with reference thereto.

2. To permit the Town of Bathurst to impose an annual head tax or license fee upon all non-residents, working within the Town, provided that such tax or fee shall not exceed (together with the poll tax paid by such non-resident in his place of residence) the amount of the poll tax payable by workmen resident within the Town, during the same year.
