### HIS HONOUR THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

has been pleased to order On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that Harold H. Ritchie of Newcastle be appointed Chief Game Warden in place of L. A. Gagnon resigned.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works that R. A. Malloy be classed as First Assistant Bridge Engineer. That A. F. Belding be classed as Second Assistant Bridge Engineer. That Bernard Hagerman be appointed Third Assistant Bridge Engineer, said appointment to date from April 7, 1927.

That Miss R. M. Gordon be appointed Secretary of the Bureau of Provincial Information and Tourist Travel.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that the order-in-Council passed on the third day of March, 1927, appointing Harry Boulay of edgwick as Labor Act Commissioner and Caretaker of Settlement for the Parish of Grimmer in Restigouche County, be varied by correcting Mr. Boulay's name to Hermengilde Boulay.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that R. M. Wright of Eel River be appointed Labor Act Commissioner for the Parish of Dalhousie, Restigouche County, in place of William Murphy, deceased.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that the appointment of Albert Savole of Kendrick's Post Office, Restigouche County, as Labor Act Commissioner for the Parish of Addington, be discontinued.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that Joseph Francoeur of Val D'Amour, Restigouche County, be appointed Labor Act Commissioner for the Parish of Addington in place of Albert Savole whose services have been discontinued.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Mines that the following regulations governing fishing on the reserved portion of Restigouche River, be adopted:

1. The Reserve has been adjusted by exchanging with Mr. Archibald Rogers that portion of Soldiers Pool lying adjacent to the southern shore owned by the Province for which Mr. Rogers releases to the Province all his private water adjacent to Lot No. 147 granted to William

Habersham now owned by him excepting Soldiers Pool.

2. The Reserve is divided into the following four sections, unless otherwise authorized by the Minister:

(1) From the lower line of Lot No. 150 granted to H. P. Habersham to but not including Soldiers Pool.

(2) From but not including Soldiers Pool to the lower line of Lot No. 147 granted to William Habersham.

(3) From the lower line of Lot No. 147 granted to William Habersham to one-quarter of a mile below Larry's Brook.

(4) From one-quarter of a mile below Larry's Brook to one mile above Little Cross Point Brook.

3. Fishing on Sunday will not be permitted.

4. Fees—Resident, five dollars per day per rod; Non-Resident, twenty-five dollars per day per rod. Fees to be paid at the time of application.

5. The method of receiving applications and allocating of the fishing to the applicants shall be determined by the Minister of Lands and Mines.

6. The Minister may make all such other regulations as may be necessary for the proper administration or control of the fishing or for any other purpose in connection therewith.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Health with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, that the following amendments to Regulations of the Health Department be made:

### Health Districts.

Regulation 2 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:

Regulation 2. The province shall be divided into four health districts to be known respectively as the Northern Health District, the Eastern Health District, the Southern Health District and the Western Health District. An additional Regulation to be numbered 2A shall be added immediately after the preceding as follows:

Regulation 2A. The Northern Health District shall be composed of counties of Madawaska, Restigouche and Gloucester.

Regulation 3 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:

Regulation 3. The Eastern Health District shall be composed of the counties of Northumberland, Kent, Westmorland and Albert.

Regulation 4 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:

Regulation 4. The Southern Health District shall be composed of the Counties of Charlotte, Saint John, City and County, the County of King's and the County of Queens.

Regulation 5 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:

Regulation 5. The Western Health District shall be composed of the counties of Victoria, Carleton, York and Sunbury.
