

striking out all that part of the regulation immediately following the word "say" in the fifth line of the regulation down to and including the word "Sunbury" in the twelfth line of said regulation and substituting therefor the following "in the Northern District there shall be the sub-health district of Madawaska, Restigouche and Gloucester. In the Eastern Health District there shall be the sub-health district of Northumberland, Kent, Westmorland and Albert. In the Southern Health District there shall be the sub-health district of Charlotte, Saint John City and County, Kings and Queens. In the Western Health District there shall be the sub-health districts of Victoria, Carleton and Sunbury."

Regulation 7 is hereby amended by adding immediately after the word "districts" in the last line of the regulation the following words "and all such other members as the Minister may direct or may have directed from time to time."

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Health that as the term of office of W. J. Crawford, employing plumber, and Joseph P. Hennebery, journeyman plumber, have expired upon the Plumber's Examining Board that William J. Crowley of Moncton and Francis Walker of Saint John be appointed as Members of the Plumber's Examining Board.

HIS HONOUR, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Order respecting the incorporation of Companies by Letters Patent under the New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916, and amendments thereto which is to take effect from the date hereof, and all previous Orders and Regulations relating thereto are rescinded:

1. The Honourable the Provincial Secretary is hereby designated as the Officer charged with the issue of Letters Patent and Supplementary Letters Patent; and the Department of the Honourable the Provincial Secretary as the Department through which such issue shall take place.

2. The signatures of the subscribers to the Petition for Letters Patent or Supplementary Letters Patent, or to the Memorandum of Association, shall be verified by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Provincial Secretary.

3. The following is the Schedule of Fees payable under the 126th Section of the said Act:

On Supplementary Letters, when ap-

plication is to increase the Capital Stock, the fee shall be payable upon the increased amount for which Letters are applied for, according to the foregoing scale.

In all other cases a fee of \$50.00.

All fees must be paid in cash or by an accepted cheque, payable to the order of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer or Deputy Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, and must be transmitted by Registered Letter.

The fees to be charged upon the incorporation of companies by Letters Patent under the New Brunswick Companies Act 1916 Section 17 for charitable, philanthropic, temperance, religious, social, literary, educational or other like purposes, where there is no capital stock and where the cost value of the real and personal property specified under Section 17, shall be as follows:

Where cost value does not exceed \$1,000.00, a fee of	\$10.00
Over \$1,000.00 and not exceeding \$2,000.00 a fee of	15.00
Over \$2,000.00 and not exceeding \$3,000.00 a fee of	20.00
Over \$3,000.00 and not exceeding \$4,000.00 a fee of	25.00
Over \$4,000.00 and not exceeding \$5,000.00 a fee of	30.00
And for \$5,000.00 and upwards the same fee shall be charged as for trading company. Also that the fee for one insertion in the Royal Gazette of the notice of granting letters patent shall be \$2.20 per square.
