W. STUART EDWARDS,

Whereas it hath pleased Almighty God in His great goodness to vouchsafe this year to Our Dominion of Canada, a bountiful harvest and other blessings. We therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgement have thought fit by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada to appoint and We do appoint Monday, the Seventh day of November, 1927 (Armistice Day), as the day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year and We enjoin all Our Loving Subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of thanksgiving.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness: Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Counsellor the

Right Honourable Francis Alexander Anglin, Chief Justice of Canada, and Deputy of Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Cousin Freeman Viscount Willington, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this Twenty-first day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the eighteenth year of Our Reign.

Regulation No. 42, New Brunswick Liquor Control Board (Approved Sept. 21, 1927)

42. A druggist or manufacturing chemist holding a license issued by the National Revenue Excise Branch as provided for by Circular 191-C shall procure from the Board a Permit to have in his possession alcohol purchased by him under his Excise license and he shall keep a record book showing all purchases of alcohol made by him under such license and the disposal made by him of such alcohol; and whenever required by the Board, he shall furnish to the Board a certified copy of the said record within a week after the same is demanded and for such period as is named in the demand.
