Letters Patent Granted

"SEASIDE HALL COMPANY LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twentieth day of September, A.D. 1927, incorporating Leonard H. Smith, Merchant; Melville Doherty, Clerk; Isaac Johnston, Labourer; Cleveland Mitchell, Weaver; Walter Thomas, Farmer; Shier Johnston, Fagan Manager; and Daniel, G. Hanson, Custom Officer; all of the Town of Saint Andrews, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, take over and acquire the property situate in the Town of Saint Andrews, in the County of Charlotte in the Province of New Brunswick, now vested in and held by trustees for Seaside Lodge, Knights of Pythias, Saint Andrews N. B., together with the hall and other improvements thereon, on such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon by and between the said trustees and the proposed company.

To purchase, lease, receive by gift, or bequest, of otherwise acquire and hold property both real and personal to a value not exceeding the amount of Four Thousand Dollars, and the profits and income therefrom, and to hold the same in trust for the objects and purposes of the Company by the name of "Seaside Hall Company, Limited".

To build, erect, establish, equip and maintain, buildings, offices, halls, clubs, club-rooms and apartments necessary or useful to the undertakings of the Company.

To sell, deed, transfer, mortgage or pledge lands and property in fee simple or otherwise, and to lease in whole or in part the building or buildings of the said Company.

To borrow money, and to make, draw, take, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, debentures and agreements for sale.

To carry on fairs, bazaars and entertainments of all legal kinds for the purposes of raising funds to further the objects of the Company.

To take an active interest in the social welfare of the community and to provide in any little way for the recreation, literary and musical improvement of the members of the Company and of Seaside Lodge, Knights of Pythias, Saint Andrews, N. B.

To pass and adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may deem necessary respecting the admission and expulsion of members, their respective rights and privileges of such members, the number, constitution, powers and duties of its officers and committee of management and generally for the administration of its officers, to alter or repeal all or any of such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may see fit, to delegate to its committee of management all or any of its powers of passing, adopting, altering and repealing such by-laws, rules and regulations.

To invest any part of the moneys of the Company in bonds, debentures, mortgages, or other securities as recognized by "The Trustee Act" being Chapter 162 of the Consolidated Statutes of the Province of New Brunswick, 1902, as being good and valid investments.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above mentioned objects and purposes of the Company, by the name of "Seaside Hall Company, Limited", with no capital stock but shall have power to acquire Real and Personal Property to a cost value not exceeding Four Thousand Dollars, with the Head Office at the Town of Saint Andrews, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH Certified Milk Notice

Section 2, sub-section (b) of the amended regulations of the Saint John Sub-District Board of Health, additional to the Regulations of the Department of Health regarding Dairies and Milk (Certified Milk Regulations), is hereby further amended by the addition to No. 8 of such sub-section of the following:

Every person whose work brings him or her in regular contact with the production or handling of Certified Milk, shall hold a certificate from a regularly qualified physician certifying to the fact that within twelve months laboratory and other examinations have been made indicating that said person is free from tuberculosis, that said person is not a carrier of typhoid and that said person is free of any disease capable of being spread through milk supplies.

NOTICE Raw Milk (Grade A.) Not Pasteurized.

Regulations to amend the Regulations of the Saint John sub-district Board of Health, additional to the Regulations of the Department of Health regarding Dairies and Milk, under authority of Section 44, of the Public Health Act 1918.

Section 2, of the Regulations of the Saint John sub-District Board of Health, additional to the regulations of the Department of Health regarding Dairies and Milk is hereby further amended by the addition after the words "certified Milk or Cream as hereinafter defined", of the words "And except Raw Milk" Grade A, as hereinafter defined", and by the addition to the same section of an additional sub-section (c), which shall read as follows:

(c) It shall be unlawful to apply the term Raw Milk—Grade A—to any milk which does not comply with the following standard:

1. It shall be taken from a herd, all animals of which have been subjected annually to the Tuberculin test and certified without reaction. Such tests to be made by a veterinary surgeon in the employ of the Provincial Department of Agriculture, or one approved by the sub-District Board of Health.

All animals failing to pass such Tuberculin test shall be removed from the buildings, yards and pastures in which the herd or any part thereof is kept.

2. Raw Milk—Grade A—shall, (unless otherwise specified in these regulations) conform to the standards provided and be produced and handled strictly in accordance with the regulations of the Department of Health of New Brunswick regarding "Dairies and Milk".

3. It shall be free from blood, pus, sediment, or disease producing organisms.

4. It shall be free from disagreeable odor or taste.

5. It shall be cooled to 55 degrees F. or under, within one hour after milking, and kept at or below that temperature until delivered to the consumer.

6. It shall, immediately after being cooled, be bottled in sterile bottles which shall be immediately sealed.

7. It shall be plainly labelled Raw Milk—Grade A—(not pasteurized) with the name of the dairyman producing same and the day or date of milking.

8. Every person whose work brings him or her in regular contact with the production or handling of Raw Milk—Grade A—shall hold a certificate from a regularly qualified physician certifying to the fact that within 12 months laboratory and other examinations have been made indicating that such person is free from tuberculosis, that such person is not a carrier of typhoid, and that such person is free of any disease capable of being spread through milk supplies.
