NOTICE

REGULATIONS GOVERNING FISHING ON THE RESERVED PORTION OF RESTIGOUCHE RIVER.

1. The Reserve has been adjusted by exchanging with Mr. Archibald Rogers that portion of Soldiers Pool lying adjacent to the southern shore owned by the Province for which Mr. Rogers releases to the Province all his private water adjacent to Lot No. 147 granted to William Habersham now owned by him excepting Soldiers Pool.
2. The Reserve is divided into the following four sections, unless otherwise authorized by the Minister:
 - (1) From the lower line of Lot No. 159 granted to H. P. Habersham to but not including Soldiers Pool.
 - (2) From but not including Soldiers Pool to the lower line of Lot No. 147 granted to William Habersham.
 - (3) From the lower line of Lot No. 147 granted to William Habersham to one-quarter of a mile below Larry's Brook.
 - (4) From one-quarter of a mile below Larry's Brook to one mile above Little Cross Point Brook.
3. Fishing on Sunday will not be permitted.
4. Fees. Resident, five dollars per day per rod. Non-Resident, twenty-five dollars per day per rod. Fees to be paid at the time of application.
5. The bag limit is not more than twenty fish in any four day period.
6. The method of receiving applications and allocating of the fishing to the applicants shall be determined by the Minister of Lands and Mines.

7. The Minister may make such other regulations as may be necessary for the proper administration or control of the fishing or for any other purpose in connection therewith.

PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 43 of Chapter 29, 12 Geo. V., 1922 all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "a protected area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

No person may enter upon any forest land after May 15th, 1927, until November 1st, 1927 for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing, or picnicking or for other purposes, without first having registered with a local fire warden, Councilor, game vendor, or other person duly authorized, giving his name, the route, destination purpose and duration of the trip with dates, and having obtained a registration certificate. Such certificate shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons or Companies shall not be subject to the above regulations, namely: Licensees or owners or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or to their employees, or to the fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, or to persons accompanied by registered guides, or to holders of hunting, fishing, guides or mining Licenses or Leases; or to Clergymen, Teachers, pupils accompanied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts. All persons shall when requested by any fire warden show their license and give the above mentioned information regarding their stay in the forest.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$100.00.

NEW REGULATION REGARDING THE PAYMENT OF BOUNTIES ON WILDCATS

When any person shall have killed a wild cat within the Province, he may exhibit the entire skin thereof, with the tip of the tail in as perfect a state as when killed excepting natural decay, before a Warden or Justice of the Peace, and make affidavit stating that he is the person who killed the wild cat, the skin of which is exhibited, and the date when and Parish and County where such wild cat was killed. Such Warden or Justice of the Peace shall thereupon cut off the whole of the tip of the tail from such skin return the same to such person and issue to such person a certificate in form set out herewith. Upon receipt of such affidavit, certificate and tip of the tail by the Minister of Lands and Mines, he shall order the payment of the sum of Five Dollars by the Province to the person who killed such wild cat. Any Warden or Justice of the Peace is hereby authorized to take the affidavit hereinbefore mentioned.

NEW MINING ACT

The public is hereby informed of the passage on April 21st, 1927 of a Mining Act to take the place of the one up to that time in force. Under the provisions of the new Act no prospecting or searching for minerals may be made without first obtaining a prospecting license but upon obtaining this license, the fee for which is ten dollars, the holder thereof may stake out one or more but not exceeding ten claims of 40 acres each. These claims must be recorded at the Department of Lands and Mines, Fredericton within thirty days. If certain required work is performed on the claims the holder thereof may obtain a yearly mining license at a cost of \$10 per claim. The opening up and
