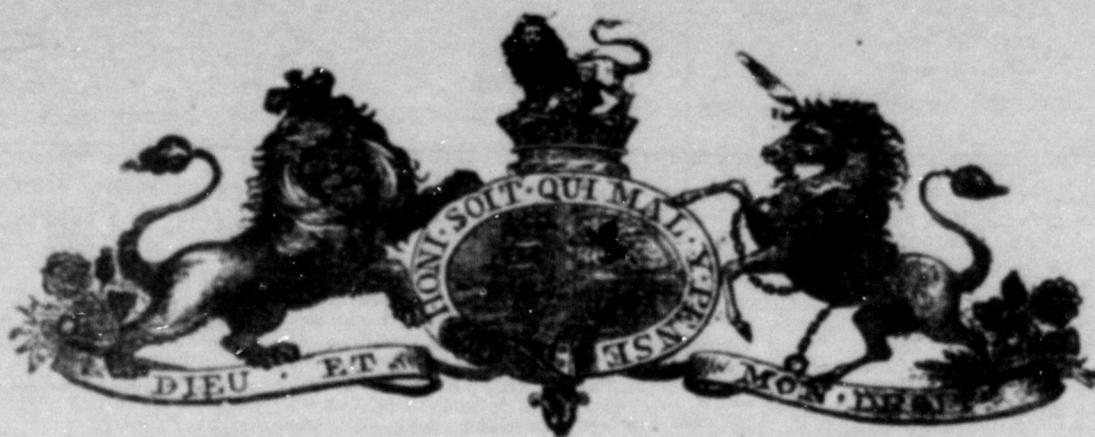

HIS HONOUR THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR has been pleased to order, on the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Health that Health Regulations, 9, 10, 11, 13, and 16, be amended as follows:

Reg. 9. In the twenty-second and twenty-third lines of Regulation 9, delete the words "recovering vital statistics," and substitute therefor the words "receiving notices of".

Reg. 10. In the second line of Regulation 10, change the word "three" to "two" and delete the fifth line of said Regulation.

Reg. 11. Delete the words "all three" in the third line of the second paragraph of Regulation 11, and substitute therefor the word "both".

Reg. 13. Delete the entire Regulation 13.

Reg. 16. Delete all the words following the word "Section" to the end of the Regulation, and substitute therefor the words "42 of the Public Health Act of 1918 as amended and consolidated by the Act of Legislature 1927".

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Health that Health Regulations Numbers 69 and 70, relating to Dairies and Milk, be amended as follows:

Reg. 69. Insert the word "of" between the words "be" and "glass" in the third line of Regulation 69.

Reg. 70. In Line ten of Regulation 70, between the words "vessels" and "and" insert the words "in sterilized container".

Letters Patent Granted

"J. W. AND J. ANDERSON, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Fourteenth day of September, A. D. 1927, incorporating William Anderson, Merchant; Kate Anderson, Widow; and James Gordon Anderson, Accountant; all of the Village of Burnt Church, in the Parish of Alnwick, in the County of Northumberland, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, take over or otherwise acquire as a going concern and carry on in all or any of its branches, the general store, fishing, lumbering and towing business and undertakings presently carried on at Burnt Church, N. B., under the name and style of "J. W. & J. Anderson" with any part of or all real estate and personal estate and property in connection therewith.

To carry on generally the business of store-keeping, merchants and importers of all kinds of goods, fish and lumber and to deal in articles, commodities and chattels of every kind.

To design, construct, purchase, operate, repair, charter, lease or otherwise deal in and dispose of any ships, vessels, tugs, dredges, scows, barges and the equipment pertaining thereto, and to engage in the business of towing, lightering or salvaging, barges, floats, rafts, craft or cargoes of any kind or description.

To engage in the business of lumbermen and lumber brokers and to own, operate or lease, mills, camps, sites, rights or privileges for the procuring, manufacture or sale of pulp-wood, ties, lumber and all its products or any commodities of wood or kindred materials.

To carry on the business of fishermen, and to buy, sell, export or otherwise trade in and to treat, cure and prepare fish of all kinds, boats, nets and gear and fishing supplies of all descriptions.

To carry on any business whether trading or manufacturing which may be incidental to or necessary to the promotion of the business or any part thereof.

To hold, own, purchase, mortgage, lease, acquire, sell and convey real and personal estate or property necessary or incidental to any of the objects or purposes of the corporation.

To issue bonds or other evidence of indebtedness from time to time with or without security or secured wholly or in part by the property of the corporation.
