Department of Lands and Mines, Fredericton, N. B., on Thursday the 23rd day of September, 1927, at noon, viz:

County of York, Parish of North Lake about 15 chains in a North easterly direction from where the line between the Parishes of North Lake and McAdam strikes Sandy Cove, being at the head of Sandy Cove, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a yellow birch tree standing on the northern bank or shore of Sandy Cove, a distance of thirty chains and fifty links measured on a course north 24 degrees and fifteen minutes east by the magnet of the year 1927 from a pine stake standing on the western bank or shore of said Sandy Cove where the same is intersected by the Northern limit of first tract, granted to C. F.
