

Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Scal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness: Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Cousin Free-In man Viscount Willingdon, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order

of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Excel-lent Order of the British Empire, Gov-ernor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in our City of Ottawa, this nineteenth day of Sep-tember, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twentyeight and in the nineteenth year of Our Reign.



for the following purposes, namely: To carry on a financial agency and brokerage business of all descriptions and in particular to act as agents, represen-tatives or managers of any person, firm, association or company incorporated or unincorporated carrying on the business of finance, investment, loan, trust or security company.

To act as trustees, fiduciary. agent or attorney for any company, corpora-

tion, person or persons. To subscribe for, underwrite, buy, or otherwise acquire or to hold and own either as principal or agent or by way of collateral security shares of the capi tal stock, bonds or other security of any other company or corporation no matter where incorporated and the bonds or debentures of any government, city, town or village and to dispose of such shares. bonds, debentures or other securities and to hypothecate or pledge the same.

To lend money to any corporation or person on mortgage security, promissary note or otherwise.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and hold any real or personal property and to manage, improve, sell, ex-change or dispose of or deal with the same

To purchase or otherwise acquire or undertake all or any part of the busi-ness, property, assets or liabilities of any person, partnership or company carry-ing on business with objects similar in whole or in part to those of the Com-pany or possessed of property suitable and proper for the purposes of the Com-

pany. To let on lease or on hire the whole or any part of the real and personal prop. erty of the Company on such terms as the Company shall determine.
