To sell or otherwise dispose of the undertaking of the Company, or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company may see fit, and in particular, for shares, debentures, or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company, if authorized so to do by the vote of the majority in number of the shareholders present, or represented by proxy, at a general meeting duly called for considering the matter and holding not less than two thirds of the issued Capital Stock of the Company, by the name of "The North River Beaver and Muskrat, Limited", with a capital stock of Forty-nine Thousand Dollars divided into Four Hundred and Ninety Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the head office at the Village of Salisbury, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.

## Supplementary Letters

### "CHARLES GURD & COMPANY (MARITIME), LIMITED".

Public notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twelfth day of June, A. D. 1928, whereby the powers and purposes of the above Company are extended as follows:—

The Common Shares without nominal or par value may be issued and allotted from time to time for such consideration as may be fixed by the Board of Directors.

The preferred shares shall be issued as six and a half percent (6½ p.c.) cumulative preferred shares with and subject to the following rights, privileges and restrictions, namely:—

(a) The said preferred shares shall carry the right to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of six and a half per centum per annum (6½ p.c.) on the capital paid up thereon, such dividend to be paid quarterly upon the 15th day of March, June, September and December in each year.

(b) The said preferred shares shall rank both as regards dividend and return of capital in priority to all other shares of the company, but shall not confer any further rights to participate in profits or assets.

(c) The holders of said preferred shares shall not have any rights of voting at any meeting of the shareholders of the company except when necessary in any proposed proceeding of the company to comply with the provisions of the New Brunswick Companies' Act and any amendments thereto requiring a specified

majority vote of all the shareholders of the Company; provided, however, that if there shall be at any time in arrears and unpaid on the said preferred shares eight quarterly dividends, holders of the issued preferred shares shall thereupon acquire the right of voting at all meetings of the shareholders of the company; every holder of preferred stock being entitled to one vote for each fully paid share thereof, and such right to vote shall be retained by the holders of the preferred shares until all dividends in arrears upon the preferred shares have been paid, whereupon the holders of the preferred shares shall cease to have voting rights except as aforesaid for the purpose of complying with the New Brunswick Companies' Act.

(d) The Company shall have the right from time to time to purchase for cancellation any of the said preferred shares at any price under 105 per centum in the open market at the market price, and in addition shall have the right and power at any time upon sixty days' notice to redeem on any dividend date the whole or any part of the outstanding preferred shares of the Company without the consent of the holders thereof upon the payment of the sum of One Hundred and Five Dollars (\$105.00) per share and accumulated dividends thereon; redemption shall be made subject to such provision and regulations as the Directors from time to time determine, including the determination of drawing by lot where a portion only of the preferred shares of the Company is to be redeemed.

To reimburse any Director or any other person or any firm or company by way of commission or otherwise for selling or placing or guaranteeing the selling or placing of any shares, bonds, debentures or debenture stock of the Company.

To purchase or redeem any issued preferred shares of the capital stock of the Company.
