Letters Patent

"GUNDY-PYMORE, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act," (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927.) Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Nineteenth day of September, A. D. 1928, incorporating William Harvey Stewart, Manager; Ralph Dommett, Agent; and Ralph Watson Hewson, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on and develop in all or any of its branches the business of manufacturers, importers and exporters of, and dealers, wholesale and retail, in all classes of nets, fitted and unfitted, coloured or uncoloured, used for fishing or any other purpose, and made from any animal or vegetable fibre, wire or steel and other forms of nets used for the protection of buildings, waterways, steam, sailing or other seagoing craft against enemy attack or damage from bombs, aeroplanes or any other form of danger, ropes, lines, twines, threads and yarns of any description made from any animal or vegetable fibre or from steel or other metal, also to carry on the business of weaving or braiding of nets, hatching, carding, rolling, batching, scutching, bleaching, colouring or any other process used in the trade of net making and fitting and spinning and twisting of fibres or wires into rope, lines, twines, yarns or threads or any other articles of a kindred nature, and

To carry on any other businesses, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in

connection with the above mentioned businesses or any of them or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

To purchase or acquire by original application or otherwise any trademarks or like rights in connection with any goods manufactured or dealt in by the Company, and any patents, brevets d'invention, licenses, concessions, or like rights, or any secret or other information for or in connection with any invention which may seem to the Company capable of being profitably used in connection with the Company's business, or any interest in, license in respect of, or right to use the same, and to use, exercise, grant licenses in respect of, or otherwise turn to account, any such trademarks, patents, or other rights, and to expend money in experimenting upon and testing, or seeking to improve any patents, inventions, secret processes or rights which the Company may acquire or propose to acquire.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any of the businesses, property, or liabilities of any Company or person carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on or which may be deemed likely to injure by competition this Company, or possessed of property which may seem suitable for the purposes of this Company.

Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, or on hire or otherwise to acquire any property whatsoever, real or personal, or any estate or interest therein, or any rights or privileges which may be considered desirable in the interests of the Company.

To erect, construct, lay down, enlarge, equip, alter, and maintain any buildings, fixtures and works convenient for the Company's business.

To construct, manufacture, install, buy, sell and deal in plant, machinery and appliances capable of being used in connection with any business which the Company is authorized to carry on.

To lend money upon security or without security and to guarantee the payment of any moneys, or the performance of any contracts, liabilities, duties, obligations or engagements, and to receive money on deposit and to become liable or responsible for money, and to undertake obligations of every kind and description, upon such terms as the Company may consider desirable.

To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required in such manner as the Company may from time to time determine.

To make, draw, accept, endorse and negotiate promissory notes, bills of exchange, and other negotiable instruments.

To borrow and raise money for the purposes of the Company's business.

To mortgage and charge the under-
