"SUSSEX FILLING STATION LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927) Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-seventh day of June, A. D. 1927, incorporating, George Holland Lounsbury, Salesman; J. Alyre Cormier, Salesman; both of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New

Brunswick; and Walter F. Lutes, Contractor; of the Town of Sussex, in the County of Kings and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes namely:

To purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, own, sell, assign and transfer or otherwise dispose of, invest, trade and deal in and with automobiles, motor cars, trucks, tractors, (flying machines, boats, farm machinery) and other vehicles and parts thereof.

To carry on the business, occupation and employment of manufacturers and repairers of, and dealers in automobiles, motor cars, trucks, tractors and other vehicles and parts thereof, and of all and any articles connected with the manufacture and repair thereof and the sale and disposition thereof, including motor vehicles accessories of every kind and description, including oils and gasoline.

To manufacture, buy, sell, import, export, repair and generally deal in rubber articles and goods of all kinds of which rubber is a component part, together with the various materials which enter into the manufacture of such articles and goods.

To buy, sell, deal in, manufacture, store, paint, clean, wash, repair, lease, use, operate maintain and let on hire, automobiles, trucks, taxi cabs, omnibuses, sight-seeing cars, motor cycles, bicycles, conveyances and vehicles of very kind and description propelled or drawn by any form of power for the transportation of persons, animals, merchandise, baggage and goods, and all accessories, parts and things used in the manufacture, maintenance and working thereof.

To purchase, mortgage, lease or otherwise acquire to hold, use, enjoy and to sell or otherwise dispose of all real or personal property, rights or privileges which may be necessary or useful for the carrying on of the business of the Company.

To acquire, maintain and operate buildings, storage, cleaning, painting, repairing caring for and keeping for hire therein all vehicles of every kind.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights by the name of "Sussex Filling Station, Limited", with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into Fifty Shares of One Hundred Dollars each, with the head office at the Town of Sussex, in the County of Kings and Province of New Brunswick.

M., and on Wednesday, July 18th, 1928, at the St. Louis Hotel, Campbellton, beginning at 9:00 A. M.

"Candidates shall be British Subjects, shall be over twenty-two years of age and shall satisfy the examiners that they have had two years' experience in scaling and measuring logs before being permitted to take the examination." (Sub-section 4, Section 7, Chap. 33.)
