Letters Patent

"EASTERN BAKERIES, LTD."

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, (being Chapter 88 of the Revised

Statutes, 1927). Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Thirteenth day of April, A. D. 1928, incorporating John Roberts Gale, Broker; Cyrus Fiske Inches, Barrister-at-Law; and James Bernard Dever, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of wholesale and retail bakers, confectioners, caterers and biscuit, cake and pastry manufacturers.

To deal in all kinds and description of cooked foods, and also in any products required with the same, with power to make and manufacture bread, biscuits, cakes and the like, and to buy and sell the same.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any of the assets, business, property, privileges, contracts, rights, obligations and liabilities of any company, society, partnership or person carrying on any part of the business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company, and to pay for the same in cash or in shares of this Company or partly in cash and partly in shares.

To remunerate by payment in cash, stock, bonds, or any other manner, any person or persons, or corporation or corporations for services rendered or to be rendered, in placing or assisting to place, or guaranteeing the placing of any of the shares of stock of the Company, or in or about the formation or promotion of the Company, or in the conduct of its business.

To distribute in specie or otherwise, as may be resolved, any assets of the Company among its members, and particularly the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of any other Company that may take over the whole or any part of the assets or liabilities of the Company.

To take or otherwise acquire and hold shares in any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To sell or dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To manufacture, purchase and sell merchandise of all kinds which may be required by bakers or confectioners.

Generally to manufacture, purchase, sell or otherwise dispose of goods, wares and merchandise of all kinds and description.
