PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 43 of Chapter 29, 12 Geo. V., 1922 all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "a protected area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

No person may enter upon any forest land after May 1st, 1928, until November 1st, 1928, for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing, or picnicking or for other purposes, without first having registered with a local fire warden, Councilor, game vendor, or other person duly authorized, giving his name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates, and having obtained a registration certificate. Such certificate shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons or Companies shall not be subject to the above regulations, namely: Licensees or owners or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or to their employees, or to the fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, or to persons accompanied by registered guides, or to holders of hunting, fishing, guides or mining Licenses or Leases; or to Clergymen, Teachers, pupils accompanied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts. All persons shall when requested by any fire warden show their license and give the above mentioned information regarding their stay in the forest.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$100.00.
