Notice of Assessment

Notice is hereby given that under and by virtue of the powers conferred on this Board by the Workmen's Compen-sation Act, every employer who shall en-gage in any of the industries named below is and shall be assessed, at the rate men-tioned opposite the name of such industry upon the amount of the pay-roll of such employer (or otherwise, as the case may to be ascertained as provided in the said Act:
