## Letters Patent

"ASHLEY COLTER, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927) Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Second day of November, A. D. 1928, incorporating Richard B. Hanson, Kings Counsel; Charles L. Dougherty, Barrister-at-Law; and William J. West, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, take over or otherwise acquire from Ashley A. Colter, the general lumber manufacturing and contracting business now carried on by the said Ashley A. Colter in the Province of New Brunswick, and elsewhere, together with all the assets, plant, stock-in-trade, real and personal property owned or used in connection therewith, and the goodwill thereof, and all the rights and contracts now held by him, together with his said undertaking, subject to the obligations, if any, effecting the same, and to pay for the same in fully paid-up shares of this Company.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire, any personal property, and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business, and in particular real estate machinery, plant and stock-in-trade.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and own, lands of whatsoever description and wheresoever situate, the timber licenses, limits and leases, claims, berths, concessions, booming grounds, driving rights, water powers, water lots and other easements, rights and privileges whatsoever.

To construct or otherwise acquire, operate, control, manage and deal in mills or machinery, machine shops, factories, works, appliances and equipment, of every description, for the cutting, transportation, handling, manufacture and finish of logs and lumber, and of any manufacture of wood, or of wood and of any other materials, severally and in combination, and of all products or by products of wood or other materials whatsoever.

Warehouses, stores, shops, sheds, yards, offices, boarding houses, work-

men's houses, dwellings, camps and structures of every description.

Tugs, boats, barges, scows, and other vessels of every description, and wharves, docks, piers, slips, and works, for the improvement of navigation, also structures, appliances and equipment for the handling of traffic in any form.

Reservoirs, dams, aqueducts, canals, flumes, drains, bridges and roadways and other works, appliances and equipment, incidental to the foregoing.

Power houses, plant, machinery, equipment and works, for the generation, distribution and utilization of any form of power, and for lighting, heating or for any other purpose, provided however, that any sale, distribution or transmission of electric, hydraulic or other power or force beyond the lands of the Company shall be subject to local and municipal regulations in that behalf.

To carry on the business of general contractors for the construction and equipment of public or private works, and of engineers; to construct, execute, carry out, equip, improve, work, develop, administer, manage or control public works and conveniences of all kinds, without limitation, and to construct, improve, maintain, work, manage, carry out, or control any roads, ways, tramways, branches or sidings, bridges, reservoirs, water courses, wharves, manufactures, warehouses, and other works and conveniences which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to advance the Company's interests, and to contribute to, subsidize, or otherwise assist or take part in the construction, improvement, maintenance, working, management, carrying out or control thereof.

To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or Company, carrying on any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the Company.

To take or otherwise acquire on the whole, shares in any other company, having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company, for carrying on any business capable of being conducted, so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To sell or dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, bonds, debentures or securities of any other Company, having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To do any and all such things ancillary to the powers hereinbefore specifically mentioned as are specified and enumerated in Section 14 of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act", (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes of New Brunswick, 1927) by the name of "Ashley Colter, Limited", with a capital stock of Sixty Thousand Dollars divided
