HIS HONOUR THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR has been pleased to order that the following regulations made by the New Brunswick Liquor Control Board be approved:

44 (1) The Costs in all prosecutions under The Intoxicating Liquor Act, 1927, shall be the same as in The Summary Convictions Act.

(2) The costs on appeals to a Judge of the County Court shall be the same as on Review in The Summary Convictions Act; but in no case shall they exceed fifteen dollars;

(3) The Court of Appeal, on hearing and determining an appeal from a County Court Judge, may, in its discretion, grant costs to either party, such costs to be not less than \$25.00 and not to exceed \$50.00.

45. When any vehicle, motor car, automobile, vessel, boat, canoe or conveyance which has been seized by the police under this Act and has not been claimed by the owner or his representative, the said vehicle, motor car, automobile, vessel, boat, canoe or conveyance shall after a period of thirty days from the date of such seizure be forfeited to His Majesty in the right of the Province. This period may be extended even after its expiration by order of the Minister.
