## Letters Patent

### "MONCTON EXHIBITION ASSOCIATION, LIMITED".

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-third day of July, A. D. 1928, incorporating, S. Jeffry Lockhart, Clerk; Pawnee V. Starkey, Stenographer; and Paul S. Colpitts, Clerk; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick,

for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on, hold, equip, lease, operate and promote baseball matches or other athletic sports and games including football, boxing, exhibition, wrestling, cricket, curling, lawn tennis, polo, lacrosse, hockey and all other ice sports and to provide such entertainments and amusements for the public generally as may be deemed desirable and for the above purposes to carry on the business of a hippodrome, circus, race course, amusement park, theatres, exhibitions and performances of all kinds, in all branches, and in such operations, to lay out and prepare any lands or emplacements for the running of automobile, motorcycle, bicycle, aeroplane and other kinds or classes of races and for the drilling and reviewing of troops and pageants.

To construct and manage grand or other stands, arenas, stadiums, booths, garages, hangars, sheds, refreshment rooms and other erections, buildings and conveniences whether of a permanent or temporary nature and which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to the Company's objects, and among other enterprises, to construct, add to, and or operate the "Moncton Stadium" and or other stadiums.

To give or arrange concerts and musical entertainments, and to employ writers and composers, and to purchase copyrights, and to give prizes and rewards.

To provide, engage and employ actors, dancers, singers, acrobats, variety performances, athletes, theatrical and musical artists, and to charge entrance or other fees to the public for said exhibitions, shows, entertainments, meetings and for any of the activities and business of the Company.

To establish any clubs, hotels, and or other conveniences in connection with the Company's property and business.

To carry on the business of hotel, cafe, restaurant, soda fountain and tavern keepers.

To carry on business as brokers in the sale of either merchandise or securities.

To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.
