"J. D. IRVING, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes, 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Second day of May, A. D., 1928, incorporating, James Dergavel Irving, Merchant; John Herbert Irving, Merchant; Walter Hazard Newcombe, Accountant; and Kenneth C. Irving, Merchant; all of Buctouche, in the County of Kent, and Province of New Brunswick, of the following purposes, namely:

To acquire, take over as a going concern the general mercantile business now being carried on by J. D. Irving, Limited at Buctouche aforesaid, now incorporated under the Dominion Companies' Act, and to assume the liabilities of the said Company, and carry on the said Corporation as merchants, lumbermen, manufacturers, canners, shippers, brokers and warehousemen.

To import, export, manufacture, buy, sell, trade and deal in all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise, either by wholesale or retail.

To buy, sell, lease, exchange or otherwise acquire all manner of machinery, gear, power, rights or privileges as may be found necessary for or incident to the successful carrying on of any or all of the various branches aforesaid.

To purchase, acquire and take over contracts and agreements of any person, firm, corporation or company, and to pay for the same either in cash or in fully or partly paid-up shares of the Company, or partly one way and partly the other.

To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company may think fit and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to these of this Company.

To loan money to customers and to guarantee the performance of contracts by such persons and to take as security therefor or for any debt due the Company chattel mortgages, mortgages, hypothecs or other security on the property of the debtors of the Company and to take
