DEPT. OF LANDS AND MINES

Regulation governing the shipping or exporting of undressed furs of silver-black foxes.

All persons desiring to export undressed furs of silver-black foxes raised in captivity to points outside of the Province or to any fur-dresser within the Province shall first obtain a permit from the Minister of Lands and Mines. All persons desiring to ship such undressed furs will make a written request and supply the Department with the number of skins, the place where they originated and if they originated outside of the Province, an affidavit from an officer of the Province where they originated must also be produced. Permit will be issued free of charge and any undressed furs of silver-black foxes shipped without this permit may be confiscated and sold.

DEPT. OF LANDS AND MINES

Regulation governing fishing on waters within the Lepreau Game Refuge.

No person shall enter upon the Lepreau Game Refuge for the purpose of fishing without a fishing permit, which

may be issued by the Minister of Lands and Mines, subject to the following conditions:

1. The permit shall be good only between May the 15th and August the 31st, inclusive.
2. No fish less than eight inches in length may be retained.
3. Not more than thirty fish shall be taken from the Refuge on any one trip.
4. Fees: Resident \$1.00 for the season. Non-resident must pay the regular fee of \$10.00 for non-resident trout license and must also have a Woods Travel Permit.
5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this regulation will be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$50.00 for each offence, and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment not exceeding one month.
