2. No fish less than eight inches in length may be retained.

3. Not more than thirty fish shall be taken from the Refuge on any one trip.

4. FEES: Resident \$1. for the season.

Non-resident must pay regular fee of \$10 for a trout license and must also have a Woods Travel Permit.

5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this regulation will be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10, and not more than \$50 for each offence, and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment not exceeding one month.

BECAQUIMAC GAME REFUGE.

Public notice is hereby given that the following described area is set apart as a Game Refuge, to take effect on and after September first, 1929. This area is situated in the Parishes of Brighton and Northampton in the County of Carleton and in the Parish of Southampton in the County of York, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the northern side of the right-of-way of the Gibson Branch of the Canadian Pacific Railway at Shewan Station, the said point being the intersection of the above mentioned railroad with the right-of-way of the abandoned narrow gauge railroad to Hartland, thence in a north easterly direction along the eastern side of the said right-of-way of the said abandoned railroad, a distance of four miles more or less, to the southern side of the Pole Hill road so called thence in an easterly direction along the southern side of the said Pole Hill road, a distance of 6.75 miles, more or less, to the western bank or shore of the South Branch Becaguimac River the said point being opposite to the dividing line between lot No. 36 granted to Charles Crabb and lot No. 37 granted to John R. Hoyt in Cloverdale Settlement, thence along the said bank or shore in a southerly direction following its various courses to the western side of the highway road from Cloverdale to Mapleton, thence in a southerly direction along the said western side of the said last mentioned highway, a distance of four miles, more or less, to its intersection with the north western side of the lumber road leading to Nackawic station, thence in a westerly direction along the north western side of the said lumber road a distance of four miles, more or less, to the northern side of the right-of-way of the Gibson Branch of the Canadian Pacific Railway at Nackawic station thence along the said northern side of the said right-of-way in a north westerly direction, a distance of nine miles, more or less, to the place of beginning and containing forty-three square miles, more or less, and distinguished as the Becaguimac Game Refuge.

No person has the right to hunt or trap for or disturb game, fur-bearing animals or birds found within the limits of this game refuge, or travel upon it with either a gun or dog at any time.

The penalty provided for hunting or trapping within a game refuge is \$300 or six months imprisonment.
