### "FUNDY PUBLISHING COMPANY, LIMITED".

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act", (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes, 1927) Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Sixteenth day of May, A. D. 1929, incorporating, Cyrus F. Inches, Barrister-at-Law; D. King Hazen, Barrister-at-Law; and Hilda L. Carpenter, Stenographer; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire, print, publish, conduct and circulate or otherwise deal with any newspaper or newspapers or other publication and generally to carry on the business of newspaper proprietors and general publishers.

To carry on, if and when it shall seem desirable, the trade or business of general printers, lithographers, engravers and advertising agents.

To build, construct, erect, purchase, hire or otherwise acquire or provide for any buildings, offices, workshops, plant and machinery or other things necessary or useful for the purpose of carrying out the objects of the Company, by the name of "Fundy Publishing Company, Limited", with a capital stock of Twenty-five Hundred Dollars divided into Twenty-five Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the Head Office at Black's Harbour, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick.

### "PRICE BROS., LIMITED".

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes of 1927) Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Seventeenth day of May, A. D. 1929, incorporating, Hanford Price, Lumberman; George O. Price, Lumber Merchant; Austin A. Allen, Solicitor; C. F. Gregory Bridges, Solicitor; and Roscoe H. Allen, Student-at-Law; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern the business, undertaking and good-will and all or any of the assets and liabilities of "Price Brothers Limited", a Company duly incorporated under the Laws of the Province of New Brunswick, on the Fourteenth day of August, A. D. 1922, carrying on business at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, in said Province and elsewhere, and to pay for the same by the issuing of paid-up shares in the Capital stock of the Company, or partly in cash and partly in paid-up shares, or otherwise.

To carry on and operate a general lumber and milling business in all its branches, including the cutting, driving, sawing, manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in logs, timber, wood, posts, laths, shingles, railway ties, and lumber of every kind and description, manufac-

tured or unmanufactured, and both wholesale and retail.

To purchase, lease and otherwise acquire, own, hold, control, operate and dispose of all such real and personal property, timber and lumber limits, leases, licenses, mills, machinery, plats easements, franchise rights, and privileges which the Company may think necessary, desirable or convenient for any of the purposes thereof.

To erect, maintain and operate mills, factories, work shops and buildings of every nature and description for any of the purposes of the Company.
