"CLOGG'S, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act", (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes, 1927) Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Thirteenth day of August, A. D. 1929, incorporating Arthur W. Clogg, Jeweller, of the City of Moncton and County of Westmorland; Hazel S. MacLeod, Spinster, of the City of Moncton and County of Westmorland; and E. Neil McKay, Clerk, of the City of Moncton and County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, take over or otherwise acquire as a going concern the business now being carried on in the City of Moncton, Province of New Brunswick, by and under the name of Arthur W. Clogg, and all or any of the assets or liabilities, or either or any of them of such business, together with the undertaking and good will thereof and all rights and contracts now held by the proprietor thereof, subject to the obligations, if any, affecting the same, at and for such price as may be agreed upon and to pay for the same in cash or shares to be issued and allotted as, and to be and become de facto, fully paid-up and non-assessable, or partly in cash and partly in paid up shares, or otherwise.

To act as agents for other dealers or manufacturers in any of the above mentioned merchandise.
