3. That one of the parties to the intended marriage was divorced from (his) (her) (wife) (husband) by decree of (name of the Court) on (give date) and a copy of the said decree is hereto annexed.
4. That I do not know of any cause why the said intended marriage should not be lawfully solemnized between the said parties.
- And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act. Declared before me at this day of

NOTE:—The Issuer of Marriage Licenses must see that separate forms are fully filled in for each party to the intended marriage. In case any circumstances arise which can not completely be met by such forms the Issuer must obtain previous authority for any variation from the Attorney General or the Deputy Attorney General, or if the case is urgent and he can not communicate with either of them, then such authority may be obtained in writing from the Mayor or Clerk of any City or Town, the Warden or Secretary of any Municipality, the Police or Stipendiary Magistrate of any City or Town, or any Member of the Legislative Assembly.

The Issuer of Marriage Licenses is responsible for reading over the form to the party, seeing that it is properly filled in and that the party signing apparently understands the same.

3. This Act shall come into force on the first day of January, 1930.

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## Letters Patent

### "MONCTON AIRPORT, LIMITED".

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Third day of May, A. D. 1929, incorporating, Walter U. Appleton, General Manager, Atlantic Region, Canadian National Railways; Harold N. Price, Engineer and Contractor; Timothy H. O'Brien, Bond-Dealer; Evelyn Holmes, Bank Manager; Rene A. Frechet, Architect; A. H. Grainiger, Manager T. Eaton Company, Limited; Leverett H. Price, Medical Doctor; C. Hanford Blakney, Merchant; Charles R. Baxter, Medical Doctor; William Dalziel, Commercial Traveller; and Percy D. Ayer, Publisher and Merchant; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To design, manufacture, buy, sell, let on hire and deal in aircraft and aerial conveyances of all kinds and the component parts thereof and all kinds of motors, machinery, accessories and apparatus for use in connection therewith or in the manufacture, maintenance and working thereof respectively, or in the construction and maintenance of any sheds, works, inclines or surfaces adapted for use in connection therewith.

To carry on the business of mechanical and aeronautical engineers, electricians, electrical engineers and aeronauts.

To establish and maintain lines or regular services of aircraft of all kinds and carry on the business of carriers of passengers and goods by air, and otherwise and to enter into contracts for the carriage of mails, passengers and goods by any means and in connection with any of the objects aforesaid.

To carry on the business of warehousemen and storers of goods, wares and merchandise of every kind and description whatsoever.

In connection with the business of the Company to purchase, lease or otherwise, acquire lands, water privileges or rights or interests therein respectively together with any buildings or structures that may be on the said lands and to sell, lease, exchange or otherwise deal with or dispose of the whole or any portion of the lands and all or any of the buildings or structures erected thereon, and to take such security therefor as may be deemed necessary.

To acquire, provide and maintain land, airports, air harbours, docks or buildings in the Province of New Brunswick, or any leases, rights privileges or other interest therein and to erect any buildings warehouses wharves docks or machinery on or to cultivate hold or otherwise utilize any land for the time being belonging to the Company.

To acquire and establish aerodromes, hangars, depots, sheds, airports, flying fields or flying stations for the storage, reception and use of aircraft and aerial conveyances of all kinds, and to use and conduct experiments in connection with and to promote race meetings, speed and trial tests for and aeronautical and other exhibitions.

To establish, maintain and conduct facilities for and to provide instruction in the air or on the ground of persons in the use, management, flying and piloting of aircraft of all kinds, and in the study and practice of aviation and aeronautics.

To establish, conduct, maintain, operate, finance and carry on schools, courses and studies for the theoretical and practical instruction and training of pilots and mechanics for the aerial navigation and general instruction and dissemination of knowledge with respect to the structure, construction and operation of all kinds of air craft and flying devices, navigation, engineering and kindred sciences and to examine and provide for the examination of persons desiring to become pilots or mechanics for aerial

navigation and to issue such certificates or qualification or diplomas as may be considered proper to such persons as may from time to time successfully pass the examinations prescribed or some of them, subject to any law in that behalf.

To engage in aerial exploration, transportation, map-making, mining, prospecting and surveying for its own or commercial purposes.

To engage in the business of aerial advertising, either by smoke screen, day flying, night illumination, pamphlets, signs or lights.

To carry on the business of patrolling, by means of aeroplanes or other flying machines whether heavier than air or otherwise, wooded or other areas, whether for purposes of fire or other protection or for the purposes of observation and investigation, and to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in all forms of fire fighting and other defensive equipment or devices and such other apparatus as may be connected with the said business.

To consolidate or amalgamate with any other company having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this Company.

To establish, maintain and conduct or to assist in the establishment, maintenance and conduct of any club, association or society formed for the purpose of advancing the study and practice of aviation, aerostation and aeronautics.

To make aerial photographic surveys, maps, plans and timber cruises and to collect by observations, made either with or without the assistance of aircraft, cameras and engineering equipment, and to record information and data of every kind for any and every purpose.

To carry on all kinds of engineering, mapping, survey, patrol, protective and cruising work.

To carry on a general aerial transportation business.

To manufacture, purchase, sell import, export, rent, lease and otherwise acquire or dispose of and repair cameras, parts of cameras, apparatus and devices of every description for use in taking pictures from aeroplanes, balloons, dirigibles and all forms and types of aircraft, while in flight or otherwise, acquire or dispose of all apparatus and devices necessary and desirable for attaching cameras or parts of cameras to aeroplanes, balloons and other aircraft for the purpose of taking pictures while the aircraft is in flight or otherwise; to apply for, register, take by assignment or otherwise acquire, receive, take and operate under licenses, use and grant licenses and sub-licenses concerning; pay and receive royalties and emoluments for the use of; purchase, hold, sell, assign, lease or otherwise dispose of applications for patents, patent rights, letters patent, trade-marks, trade names, processes and formulae, secret or otherwise, including improvements on any of the same, used or deemed to be useful in the manufacture or use of any or all of the articles to be acquired, manufactured, dealt in, utilized or disposed of by this Company.

To provide and maintain stations, waiting rooms, rest-rooms, food, refreshments, lunch counters and restaurants, for the accommodation of the employees, students and passengers of the Company.

To possess and exercise all or any of the powers mentioned and set forth in Section 14 of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927).

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, by the name of "Moncton Airport, Limited", with a capital stock of Four Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety Dollars divided into Four Hundred and Ninety-Nine Shares of Ten Dollars Each, with the head office at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.
