Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-eighth day of October, A. D. 1929, incorporating Harrison H. Hagerman, Teacher; Howard H. Blair, Insurance Agent; Kata M. Stewart, Nurse; Edward Perkins, Florist; and Charles L. Dougherty, Barrister; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over as a going concern under the provisions of the Last Will and Testament of Ada M. Schleyer, late of the City of Fredericton, deceased, the florist business carried on by the late Ada M. Schleyer in her lifetime, in the City of Fredericton, together with all the plant, equipment, stock-in-trade, tools, implements and fixtures used in connection therewith, and the undertaking and good-will thereof, and to issue paid-up shares of the capital stock of the said company in accordance with the provisions of the Will of the late Ada M. Schleyer, deceased.

To carry on the business of florists and gardeners in all its branches.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real and or personal property, or any rights and privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business.

To sell and dispose of the undertaking of the Company, or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company shall think fit, and particularly for shares, debentures or securities of any other Company, having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purpose of the Company.

To carry on any business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's rights.

To invest and deal in the moneys of the Company not immediately required by the Company, upon such security and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

The Company shall possess as incidental and ancillary to the powers hereinbefore enumerated, all the powers specified and enumerated in Section 14 of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act", by the name of "Ada M. Schleyer, Limited", with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into Fifty Shares
