Sir:—

I have the honour at the request of His Majesty's Government in Canada, to notify you that His Britannic Majesty desires, in accordance with article 14 (2) of the Anglo-Czechoslovak Civil Procedure Convention of November 11th, 1924, to extend the convention to that Dominion.

2. I have the honour to inform you that the authorities to whom judicial and extra judicial acts and commissions rogatoires should be transmitted are, when action is to be taken in any Province in Canada, the Attorney-General of such Province; in the North West Territories, the Commissioner of the North West Territories; and in the Yukon Territory, the Gold Commissioner of that territory. The language in which communications to such authorities and translations are to be made is English, except in the Province of Quebec where they may be made either in English or in French.

3. The Governments of the Provinces of Ontario, Manitoba, Nova Scotia, Alberta and the Yukon Territory have intimated that to ensure their due execution commissions rogatoires to be executed in their territories should contain full and complete interrogatories.

4. In requesting that you will be so good as to acknowledge this communication on behalf of your Government, I have the honour to suggest that the exchange of notes thus constituted should be regarded as placing the matter on formal record, and that the extension of the terms of the convention to the Dominion of Canada should be considered as coming into force from the date of this note.

PROCLAMATION.

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 42 of Chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes 1927, all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "a protected area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

(1) No person shall enter upon any area of forest land, after May 1st, 1929, until November 1st, 1929, for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing or picnicking or for any other purpose without having first registered with a local fire warden or other person duly authorized giving his name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates, and having obtained a Forest Travel Permit. Such permit shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons shall not be subject to the above regulations, namely: Licensees or owners or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or their employees, or any fire warden, fire fighters, land surveyors, licensed guides, or persons accompanied by licensed guides, or holders of hunting, fishing, prospecting and mining licenses or leases; or Clergymen, teachers, pupils accompanied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts when accompanied by Scout Masters.

(2) Any person who is not required to secure a Forest Travel Permit must when entering or travelling upon forest lands carry an identification card, badge, certificate or license as the case may be, and must exhibit the same and give information with regard to the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates when so required by any fire warden or other authorized person.

(3) Any person holding a Forest Travel Permit under Section 43, Chapter 32, R. S. 1927, or any person exempted by sub-section 3 of Section 42 of the same Act from securing a Forest Travel Permit, who enters or leaves forest land on roads, trails or other routes or travel where registering stations are provided and designated by notices, issued under authority of the Minister of Lands and Mines as official "Forest Travel Registering Stations" must stop at such places of registration and report to the fire warden or other authorized officer there, giving such particulars as are required of the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$100.00, or not less than ten and not more than thirty days imprisonment.
