Letters Patent

'THE RENOUS GAME CLUB, LIMITED'

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act", (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes, 1927) Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the twenty-ninth day of May, A. D. 1929 incorporating, Cyrus F. Inches, Barrister-at-Law; D. King Hazen, Barrister-at-Law; and Hilda L. Carpenter, Stenographer; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

The acquiring by purchase or lease or otherwise, and selling and disposing of fishing and hunting privileges, lands, lakes, streams and premises, and fishing and hunting rights, houses, buildings and improvements, and for the purposes of fishing, hunting, sporting and recreation, and for the mutual improvement and pleasure thereby of the members of such Company, and such other rights as are incident thereto, by the name of "The Renous Game Club, Limited", with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into Ten Shares of Five Hundred Dollars each.

The Shares of the Capital Stock shall not be transferable to a person not then being a member or a shareholder in the Company until the name of the proposed transferee or member has been first submitted for the approval of the existing shareholders or members, and approved in such manner as may be prescribed by the by-laws of the Company when incorporated. At any meeting of such Company duly called for the purpose, a by-law may be passed to authorize the making of assessments from time to time upon its members for the maintenance and support of the Company, for such sum or sums as shall be deemed necessary for such purpose, and prescribing the mode in which such assessment shall be made and paid, and how payment thereof may be enforced and what penalties, if any, as respects loss of membership, and forfeiture of shares, shall attach to non-payment of such assessments. The liability of members to be assessed for the purposes aforesaid shall, if the by-law so prescribes, attach to membership in the Company, whether the stock of the Company is fully paid-up or otherwise, and shall be a liability upon all members of the Company, independent of, and in addition to the liability at law in respect of unpaid stock. The Company may, if it see fit, purchase from any shareholder

or member desiring to dispose of the same, his share or shares in the Company, with a view of subsequently disposing of the same upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the by-laws of the Company when incorporated with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick.

Licenses to expire on the first of August, 1929, but subject to renewal to first of August 1933 in accordance with Chapter XI 3 George V 1913 for Saw Mill Licenses of the following applications for Timber Berths for the purpose of cutting all classes of lumber, will be sold at this office on Thursday the 13th day of June 1929, at noon.

Upset price \$20 per square mile in addition to stumpage.

There is no payment of any bonus required. Licenses are renewable each year by payment of \$8. per square mile and fire tax of \$3.20 per square mile. Stumpage in accordance with the regulations in force and subject to annual change.

All timber, logs, or other lumber cut upon unlicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limit of his own berth shall be seized and
