To establish, maintain and conduct an association or club for the promotion and playing of all lawful games and for social, athletic and entertainment purposes and for the promotion and carrying on of field and water sports and recreations of all kinds, and to provide playgrounds athletic fields, clubhouses, buildings, links, courts, parks, boats, canoes, lands, premises and other conveniences for the accommodation of members of the Association and their friends, of the servants and employees of the Association, and for such part of the general public or other persons as the Association shall think fit, to carry on meetings, entertainments and discussions, and generally to afford the members of the Association and their friends and such other persons as aforesaid all the usual privileges, advantages, conveniences and accommodations of an Association or Club for such purposes.

To take an active interest in the social welfare and good of the community and to promote, carry on, assist in or otherwise engage in any scheme, work or undertaking for that purpose.

To take over any property real or personal now owned or held by the unincorporated association known as the Saint John Playgrounds Association or by any person or persons in trust for the same, or otherwise held in trust for this Association awaiting its incorporation.

To purchase, take on lease, or otherwise acquire and hold, any lands, buildings easements or property real and personal which may be requisite for the purposes of or capable of being used in connection with any of the objects of the Association, to erect buildings or other structures on such lands or any of them for the purposes of the Association.

To improve, manage, develop, exchange, sell, lease or otherwise dispose of or deal with all or any part of the property or rights of the Association, and for the purposes of the Association to mortgage the real estate or otherwise raise monies.

To borrow money and to make, draw, take, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange bills of lading, warrants, debentures, agreements of sale and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To pass and adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may deem necessary respecting the admission and expulsion of members, the classification and the respective rights and privileges of such members, the fees, subscriptions and dues which it may deem advisable to impose, the number, constitution, powers and duties of its officers and of its committees of management and otherwise, and generally for the administration and management of its affairs and to provide for the imposition of penalties by way of suspension or forfeiture of membership for the breach or non-observance thereof, and to alter or repeal all or any of such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may see fit also delegate to its committee of management or executive committee all or any of its powers of passing, adopting, altering and repealing such by-laws, rules and regulations.

To do such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects by the name of "SAINT JOHN PLAYGROUNDS ASSOCIATION, LIMITED", with No Capital Stock but may acquire real and personal property to a cost value not exceeding Twenty Thousand Dollars. The Company to hold all property, both real and personal and the profits and income arising therefrom acquired by it by purchase, gift, bequest or otherwise in trust for the objects and purposes for which the Company may be incorporated, with the head office at the City of Saint John in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
