Notice is hereby given that application will be made at the next session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick for the passing of an Act to authorize the Town of Dalhousie to issue debentures:—(1) To a sum not exceeding one hundred and eight thousand dollars for the purpose of enlarging the town's water supply, redeemable in thirty years.—(2) To a further sum not exceeding one hundred and eighty thousand dollars for the purpose of installing a proper sewerage system in the town, redeemable in forty years.—(3) To a further sum not exceeding thirty-seven thousand dollars for the purpose of renewing and extending its present electric light system, redeemable in twenty years, and (4) To a further sum not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars, for the purpose of opening up and constructing new streets, roads and sidewalks, and for other general permanent improvement, including fire apparatus, redeemable in twenty years, in denominations of such amount as the town may deem advisable, payable to the bearer or holder thereof, with coupon interest not exceeding six per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Debentures Act.
