We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn acknowledgement, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint **MONDAY**, the eleventh day of November next (Armistice Day) as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

**IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF**, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. **WITNESS:** Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Cousin Freeman Viscount Willingdon, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Exalt-

ed Order of the Star of India, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

**AT OUR GOVERNMENT HOUSE**, in Our City of Ottawa, this eighteenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine and in the twentieth year of Our Reign.

## Letters Patent

"VINCENT & WETMORE, LIMITED".

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the First

day of October, A. D. 1929, incorporating, Harold Vincent, Broker; Clarence R. D. Wetmore, Broker; and Charles J. Melliday, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on business as grocery brokers, manufacturers agents and commission agents.

To buy, sell and otherwise deal in goods, wares and merchandise of all kinds and descriptions, whatsoever.

To carry on a general brokerage, exporting and importing business.

To carry on a general mercantile business as importers and dealers in all kinds of goods, wares and merchandise, whether wholesale or retail, and by means of stores, warehouses, shops or agencies in all such places as the Company may deem profitable and advantageous.

To act as commission and commercial agents in respect of all kinds of natural, imported or manufactured products of every nature and description, and to buy and sell all such products upon a commission, salary or other lawful consideration.

To purchase, sell, manufacture, handle on commission and otherwise deal in cheese, butter, flour, hog products, grain and generally all classes of farm products, factory supplies and all manufactured articles.

To conduct a general warehousing and storage business, and in connection therewith to engage and deal with warehouse receipts, make and obtain advances thereon, and generally to do all things which may be necessary or incidental to any of the foregoing classes of business.

To buy, sell, manufacture, import and export, and generally deal in all kinds of canned, preserved, pickled and cured fruits and vegetables, grains, provisions, meats, fish, fowl and game, and extracts, syrups, jams, marmalades, essences, sauces, relishes, jellies, cider and cider vinegar, aerated and evaporated fruits, products of the field, farm and forest.

To purchase, sell and otherwise deal in all kinds of merchandise which may be required by bakers or confectioners and generally to purchase, sell or otherwise dispose of goods, wares and merchandise of all kinds and descriptions.

To buy, sell, import, export and deal in cocoa, chocolate, confectionery and confectionery supplies in all forms and processes of manufacture.

To export, import, manufacture, buy, sell and deal in goods, wares and merchandise without limiting the generality of the foregoing; the same shall be deemed to include confectionery, biscuits, candy and all goods in which sugar or flour forms a part; and to act as agents, brokers and commission merchants for
