Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Second day of September, A. D. 1929, incorporating, Charlie McDonald, Merchant; William Frederick Lane, Barrister-at-Law; and Margaret McMahon, Stenographer; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern the business and undertaking heretofore carried on in the
