To purchase lease, or otherwise in any manner, acquire any real estate, buildings, lease-hold, movable or immovable property deemed by the Company suitable or likely to be suitable for its purposes, and the same to be disposed of either for cash or on credit, or by way of exchange, or for shares or securities of any other corporation as may be deemed best for the interests of the Company.

With the approval of the shareholders to remunerate any person for services rendered to the Company in such manner as the Company may deem expedient, and more particularly by the issue and allotment of shares, bonds or other securities of the Company wholly or partly paid up, but nothing in this clause contained shall be deemed to limit the power of the directors to fix and pay the salary of any and all officers, servants, agents and employees of the Company.

To distribute the whole or any part of the property or assets of the Company in specie or money among its shareholders; provided, however, that no such distribution shall affect a reduction of the capital of the Company, except made in accordance with the provisions of the New Brunswick Companies' Act.

To pay out of the funds of the Company all costs, charges and expenses incurred or sustained in or about the promotion and establishment of the Company.

With power to hold the annual meeting of shareholders and meetings of the shareholders or directors at any place whether within or without New Brunswick.

With power to elect the directors of the Company in general meeting of the Company assembled at any place whether within or without New Brunswick.

With power to hold the first general meeting of the shareholders of the Company without statutory notice having been given provided, that all the shareholders of the Company are present at such meeting either personally or by proxy, and that all such shareholders waive such notice.

To do all such things as the Company is entitled to do under the law of the Province of New Brunswick, by the name of "Maritime Theatres, Limited" with a capital stock of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars divided into two thousand and five hundred shares of the par value of one hundred dollars each; with the head office at the City of St. John in the City and County of St. John, and Province of New Brunswick.
