The Honourable The Minister of Health and Labour reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society, with the concurrence of the President of the Council of Physicians and Surgeons of New Brunswick, has, by resolution, resolved that in the opinion of the said Council, it is advisable to make a change in the schedule of poisons being Schedule A of the N. B. Pharmaceutical Consolidated Act 1923 and add thereto "Oil of Wintergreen both natural and synthetic."

The Honourable the Minister of Health and Labour now Recommends that "Oil of Wintergreen both natural and synthetic" be added accordingly.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation.

Ordered, on the recommendation of the Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer that regulations passed on the 27th day of May, A.D. 1926, under The Theatres, Cinematographs and other Amusements Act be further amended by striking out sub-sections 2 and 3 of section 6 and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

2. For each reel of sound film, not more than 1,100 feet submitted to the New Brunswick Board of Censors, an additional fee of \$2.50 and for each reel of silent film not more than 1,100 feet submitted to the New Brunswick Board of Censors, an additional fee of \$1.50.

3. For every additional hundred feet or fraction thereof, for sound film .35c. and for silent film .15c.
