By His Honour, Major General, The Honourable Hugh Havelock McLean, K.C., V.D., LL.D., Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick.

## Letters Patent

### "ROTHESAY AVENUE SERVICE STATION, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Eleventh day of June, A. D. 1930, incorporating Stephen Henry Thorpe, Salesman; Mabel Olive Thorpe, Married Woman; and Horace Alfred Porter, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely,

To operate a garage or garages, repair shop or shops and service station, or stations, and to buy, sell and deal in gasoline and other fuels, oil and other lubricants, carbon removing fluids, polishing fluids and any substitute or substitutes for the same.

To carry on the business of importers, exporters, suppliers, marketers,

and distributors of petroleum and petroleum products and by-products of every kind and description.

To buy, sell and deal in automobiles and other vehicles, their parts and accessories and kindred articles.

To repair, reconstruct and otherwise deal with automobiles and other vehicles and any appliances in connection therewith.

To issue paid-up shares, bonds, debenture stock and other securities for the payment, either in whole or in part of the purchase price of any property, real or personal, claims, privileges, licenses, concessions, franchises, or other advantages which the Company may lawfully acquire, and for services rendered to or work performed for the Company, and also to issue such fully paid-up shares, bonds, debenture stock and other securities in payment or part payment or exchange for the shares, bonds or debenture stock and other securities of any other company.

To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

To pay out of the funds of the Company all or any of the expenses of or incidental to the formation and organization thereof.

For the purposes aforesaid to purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern the gasoline service station business in the City of Saint John now owned and operated by the Estate of Harry Lee McKnight and to pay for the same in whole or in part by the issue of fully paid shares of the Company.

And it is ordained and declared that the Shareholders of the Company may by resolution remove any Director or Directors or any officer or Officers before the expiration of his or their period of office and appoint another qualified person in his or their stead for the balance of his or their term, at any special general meeting of which notice specifying the intention to pass such resolution shall have been given by the name of "Rothsay Avenue Service Station, Limited" with a capital stock consisting of One Hundred Shares of Stock without Nominal or Par Value, which shares shall be issued from time to time for such consideration or considerations as may be fixed by the Board of Directors, provided such consideration be not in excess of the value of Fifty Dollars Per Share, with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, with power to hold meetings of Shareholders, Directors and Executive Committee of Directors (if any) at any
