"SAINT JOHN MOTOR LINE, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-fourth day of December, A. D. 1930, whereby the Capital Stock is changed as follows:—

Per Annum, shall be entitled to participate share for share with the holders of the Class B Shares in any further dividends declared or paid in said year.
