To adopt a constitution and to make and adopt by-laws, rules and regulations for the admission, supervision and expulsion of any members of any club or clubs promoted, organized, established, taken over, conducted, managed and carried on by the Company; and for the government of such members; for the establishment of different classes of members; for the assessment collection of fees and dues; for the election and appointment of Directors, Officers and Committees and the definition of their and each of their respective duties and powers; for the safe-keeping of the Company's assets, rights, properties and funds and from time to time to alter, repeal, revise, amend and vary such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations or any of them.

Generally to hold, regulate, manage, preserve, sell and dispose of the assets, interests and property of all or any such clubs.

To provide by by-law a maximum number of shares of the Capital Stock of the Company which may be held by any one person.

To provide by by-law that the Shares of the Capital Stock of the Company shall not be transferred to any person not then being a member of and Shareholder in the Company until the name of the proposed transferee is submitted to the Directors and they have approved an given consent to such transfer or upon such other terms or conditions as may be provided by such or any by-law by the name of "Miramichi Salmon Club, Limited", with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into Fifty Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the head office at Blissfield, in the Parish of Blissfield, in the County of Northumberland and Province of New Brunswick, with permission to hold annual, regular or special meetings of the Shareholders or Directors of the Company without the Province.

REGULATIONS FOR FOX PENS OR RANCHES.

No foxes shall be kept within the limits of the City of Moncton. In towns, incorporated villages, thickly settled and built up portions of the County; no fox ranch, or pens shall be established or maintained, in which foxes are intended to be kept, without a written permit from Sub-district Board of Health concerned, and no such permit shall be issued by such Board, for the keeping of such animals within 100 feet of any neighbors inhabited house, centre of street or public highway, and in every instance of a fox ranch or pens being maintained, such fox ranch or pens, shall be kept in a sanitary condition and in conformity with such regulations or bye-laws, relating thereto as the Sub-district Board concerned may, from time to time, lay down in accordance with law.
