D. 1930, incorporating, R. Bruce Clarke, Laundryman; William C. Clark, Farmer; both of Upper Rexton, in the County of Kent, and Province of New Brunswick; and H. Murray Lambert, Barrister-at-Law, of the Town of Sunny Brae, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of general laundry work, including washing, ironing, wet wash, starching and cleaning soiled linen or clothes.

Licenses to expire on the first of August 1930, but subject to renewal to 1st of August 1932, in accordance with Chapter XI of George V., 1912, for Saw Mill Licenses of the following applications for timber Berths, for the purposes of cutting all classes of lumber, will be sold at this office on Thursday the 24th day of April 1930, at noon.

Upset price \$20 per square mile in addition to stumpage.

There is no payment of any bonus required. Licenses are renewable each year by payment of \$5 per square mile and fire tax of \$3.20 per square mile. Stumpage in accordance with the regulations in force and subject to annual change.

All timber, logs, or other lumber cut upon unlicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own berth shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no timber or lumber shall be cut on any

berth applied for until it shall be purchased at public auction.

NOTICE
New Brunswick Forest Service.
Department of Lands and Mines.
PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 42 of Chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes 1927, all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "a protected area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

(1) No person shall enter upon any area of forest land, after May 1st, 1930, until November 1st, 1930, for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing or picnicking or for any other purpose without having first registered with a local fire warden or other person duly authorized giving his name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates, and having obtained a Forest Travel Permit. Such Permit shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons shall not be subject to the above regulations, namely: Licensees or owners or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or their employees, or any fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, licensed guides, or persons accompanied by licensed guides, or holders of hunting, fishing, prospecting and mining licenses or leases; or Clergyman, Teachers, pupils accompanied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts when accompanied by Scout Masters.

(2) Any person who is not required to secure a forest travel permit must when entering or travelling upon forest lands carry an identification card, badge, certificate or license as the case may be, and must exhibit the same and give information with regard to the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates when so required by any Fire Warden or other authorized person.

(3) Any person holding a forest travel permit under Section 42, Chapter 32, R. S. 1927, or any person exempted by sub-section 3 of Section 42 of the same Act, from securing a forest travel permit, who enters or leaves forest land on roads, trails or other routes of travel where registering stations are provided and designated by notices, issued under authority of the Minister of Lands and Mines as official "Forest Travel Registering Stations" must stop at such places of registration and report to the fire warden or other authorized officer there, giving such particulars as are required of the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$100.00 or not less than ten and not more than thirty days imprisonment.
