## Letters Patent

### "ALGONQUIN SEA FOODS, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised

Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-fifth day of November, A. D. 1930, incorporating Gordon F. Nicholson, Barrister-at-Law, of the Town of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick; Aubrey P. Dewar, Insurance Agent, of the Town of Milltown, in the County of Charlotte and Province aforesaid; and Louise L. Wellock, Stenographer, of the Parish of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange, concession or otherwise, real and personal property of every nature, kind and description whatsoever and any interest or rights therein, legal or equitable or otherwise howsoever, and to take hold, hold, own use, enjoy, maintain and dispose of any such real and personal or interest therein in any way whatsoever.

To import, export, purchase, plant, cultivate, grow and produce, and to prepare for manufacture, manufacture, can, pack, store and otherwise prepare for marketing, and to sell and otherwise dispose of and deal in and with domestic and foreign fruits, vegetables, meats, grains and generally natural products of every sort, nature and description.

To apply for, obtain, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, and sell or dispose of, trademarks, formulae, secret processes, patents, inventions, copyrights, grants and licenses.

To procure the Company to be licensed, registered and legally authorized to do business in any Province of the Dominion of Canada or in any other country.

To issue and allot and deliver as fully paid-up and non-assessable the shares, debentures or other securities of the Company in payment or part payment of any property real or per-
